

MWXPL Classification

Age Requirements:

Players must be 18 years of age or older, except that players 10 through 17 years of age may play with written consent from a parent or legal guardian.

The age limit for Young Guns is that if you are turning 15 in 2006 then you can play. That means you are currently 14 and will be turning 15 any time in 2006. If you are currently 15 then you will be turning 16 in 2006 and then you are too old for young guns.

Young Guns League:

The format for Young Guns is 3-player teams playing four-minute games of center flag. Each team will play up to 8 games. The top teams from the brackets then advance to the next round. Air fills are included in the entry fee. There is no paint limit for the Young Guns Division. (See the Registration Form for entry fees, classification, etc.)

Divisions:

Major 7-player events separate Rookie (Division 5), Novice (Division 4) and Open teams into different divisions. Open teams play Open, Nov play Nov, Rke play Rke (see Player Classification), whenever possible. Team seeding within a bracket is based on overall circuit ranking, how many squads each team enters, and geographical relationships.

Division 5:

A player who has not played on a National Level 7-player or X-ball/NXL Pro, Semi-Pro, Div 1, Div 2, or Div 3 previous to the current tournament or played XPSL Rookie previous to the current tournament season in two or less events. (Exception #1: A player may carry dual classification if they choose to play Div 3 in the NPPL and Div 5 in the XPSL) (See definition of National Level below).

Division 4:

A player who has not played on a National Level 7-player or X-ball/NXL Pro, Semi-Pro, Div 1, Div 2 or Div 3 previous to the current tournament or played as XPSL Rookie in more than two events. (Exception#1: If a player currently qualifies as a Div 3 player in the NPPL then they may carry dual classification for the XPSL as Div 4) (Exception #2: A player may play one NPPL event as Div 2 previous to the current season without penalty) (Exception #3: If a player has never played as Div 2 in the NPPL but plans to for 2006 they may carry dual classification as Div 2 and Div 4 for one season) (See definition of National Level below).

Open Division:

These Players are those that have played in an upper division such as D. 1, 2, 3, or Pro and Semi-pro for 1 season or less.
